

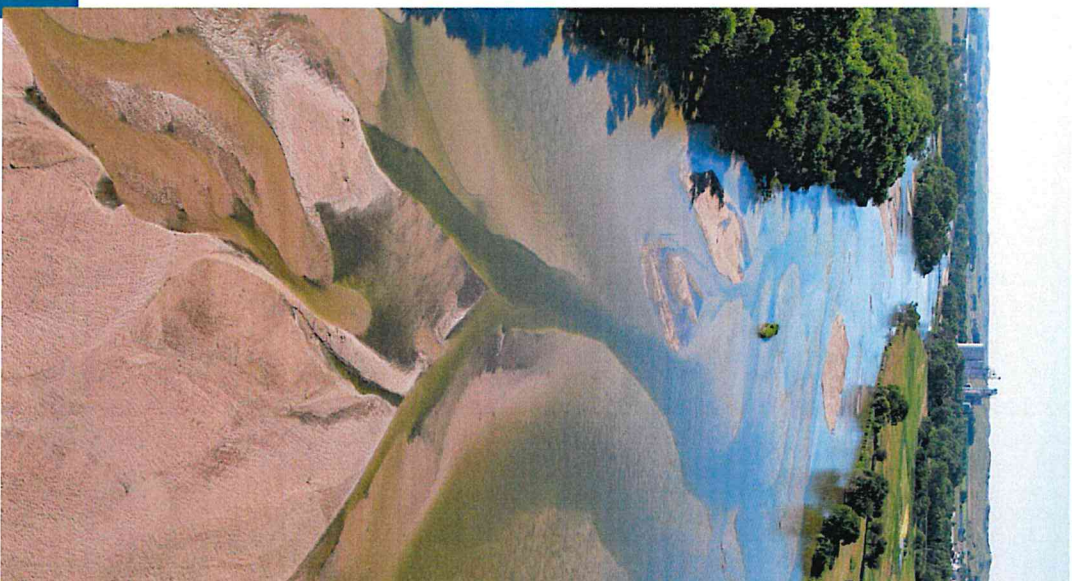
The Nebraska Department of Natural Resources manages our most precious natural resource through sound partnerships, cooperation, and science-based decision-making.

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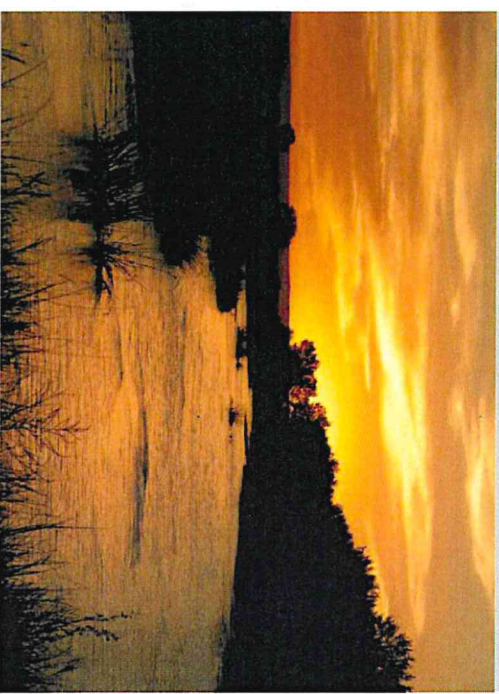

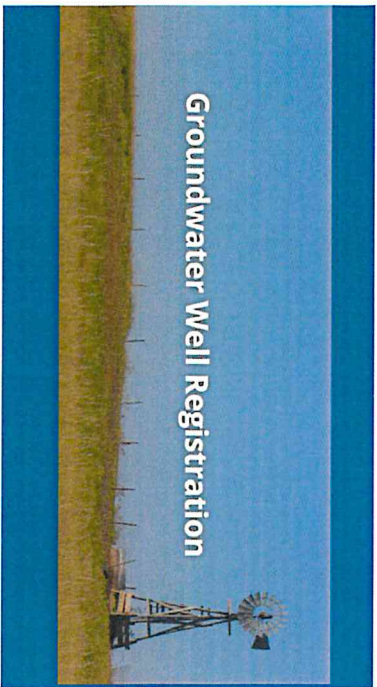

Groundwater Well Registration



WHY SHOULD YOU REGISTER YOUR WELL?

- The state of Nebraska requires that all wells pumping groundwater be registered with the state with the exception of dewatering wells that are in for less than 90 days, test wells for exploring for groundwater, and domestic and stock wells drilled prior to 1993.
- Well owners are responsible for registering existing wells that have not been previously registered.
 - Failure to register a water well is a Class IV misdemeanor.
- Nebraska's Natural Resources Districts (NRDs) use the groundwater well registration information for management decisions when declines and shortages of groundwater occur.
- State and federal agencies use the information for studies, state compacts and agreements that deal with water quality, water quantity and surface water issues between Nebraska and its neighboring states

PRIVATE WELL REVERSE OSMOSIS REBATE PROGRAM

- NDEE will administer \$1.2 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds through rebates for private well reverse osmosis systems.
- Private well reverse osmosis system rebates are available to property owners of private wells with drinking water test levels above 10 parts per million (ppm) of nitrate.
- To be eligible for this rebate, applicants will need to ensure that their well is registered with the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources

IF YOUR WELL IS NOT REGISTERED THE FORM TO REGISTER IT LOOKS LIKE THIS



To register a single groundwater well, submit the following on a **Water Well Registration form**:

1. Name(s) of owners
 - Must be exactly as described on deed or other document transferring ownership of property.
 - If more than one owner, please describe type of ownership
 - Only owner name OR company name accepted. Do not complete both
2. Drilling firm information
3. Well Location. The legal description must include ¼¼, Section, Township, Range w/direction and County and GPS coordinates
4. Permit number(s). Any permit associated with the well
5. Purpose of the well
6. A site plan is required to accompany the water well registration forms for any wells in a series
7. Replacement and decommissioning information
8. Pump and Pump Installer information
9. Well Construction Information.
10. Well Construction Casing and Screen.
11. Grout and Gravel Pack.
12. Geologic Materials Logged
13. Signature. The form must be signed and dated by the water well contractor.
