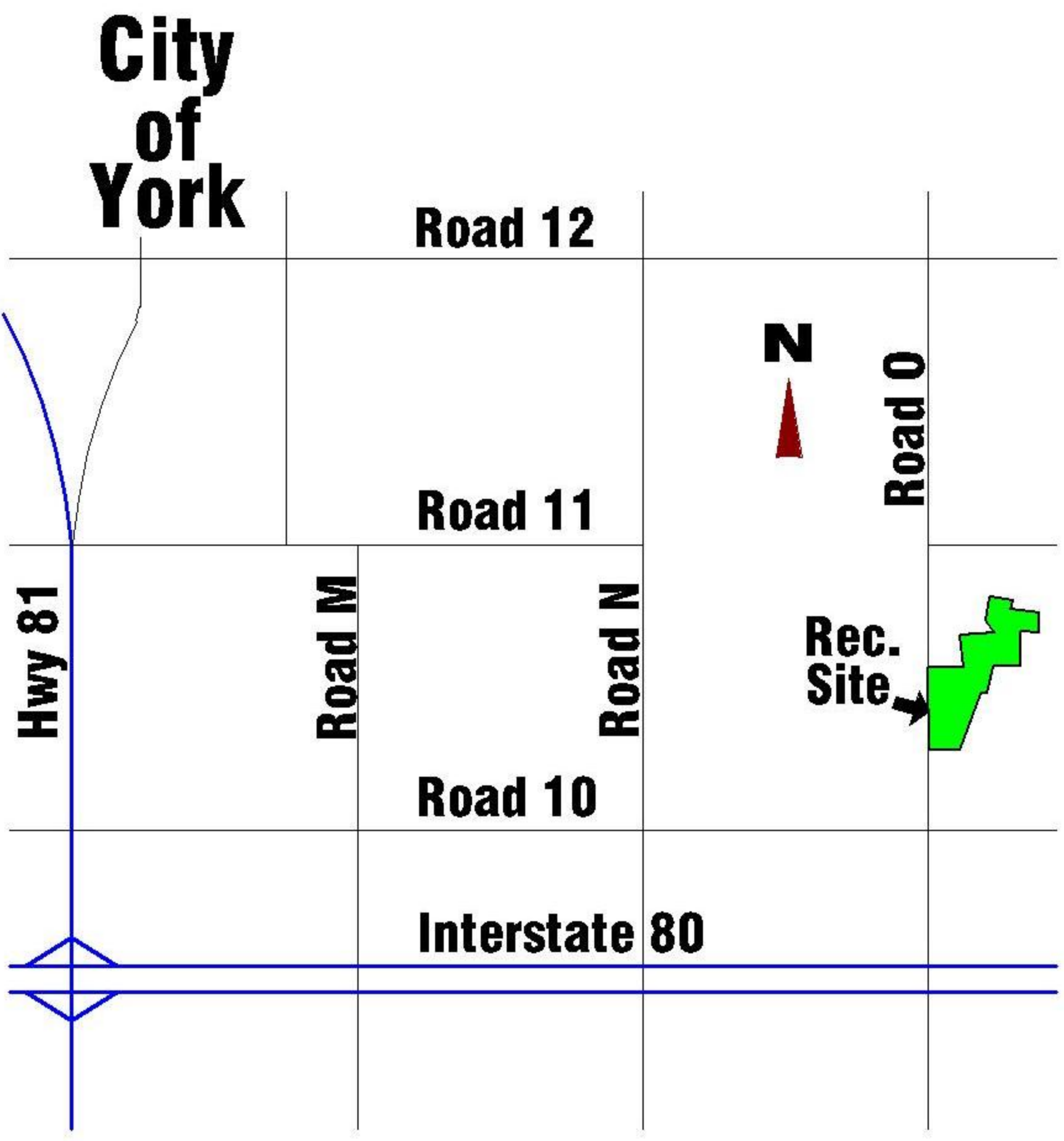

FAST FACTS

The Overland Trails Recreation Area, located 2.0 miles east and 1.0 mile south of York, Features a 14.5 surface-acre lake which stores 121 acre feet of water.

The site was named for the nearby Overland Trail, which during the 1860's was a spur off the Oregon Trail. The primary purposes of the dam and reservoir were designed to provide flood control, aquifer recharge and recreational activities.

Camping, picknicking and hiking are permitted in designated areas. Boating and canoeing area also allowed along with snow skiing, sleding, tobogganing, snowshoeing, snowmobiling and ice skating. Development at the facility remains limited to preserve wildlife habitat.
