

**FAST FACTS**

Constructed in 1998, the Oxbow Trails Recreation Area is located 1.5 miles east of Ulysses, Nebraska, and features a 43 surface-acre lake which can store 274 acre feet of water.

Named for the nearby Oxbow Trail used by pioneers during the mid-1850's, the dam and reservoir was designed to provide flood control, wildlife habitat and recreation. The lake's water source is supplied by rainfall and underground springs. A fishing jetty is accessible on the west side of the lake along with a boat ramp and dock.

The recreation area is open to hiking and camping. The trapping of furbearers is permitted during the allowable hunting and trapping season. A picnic shelter, tables and cooking grills are also available.

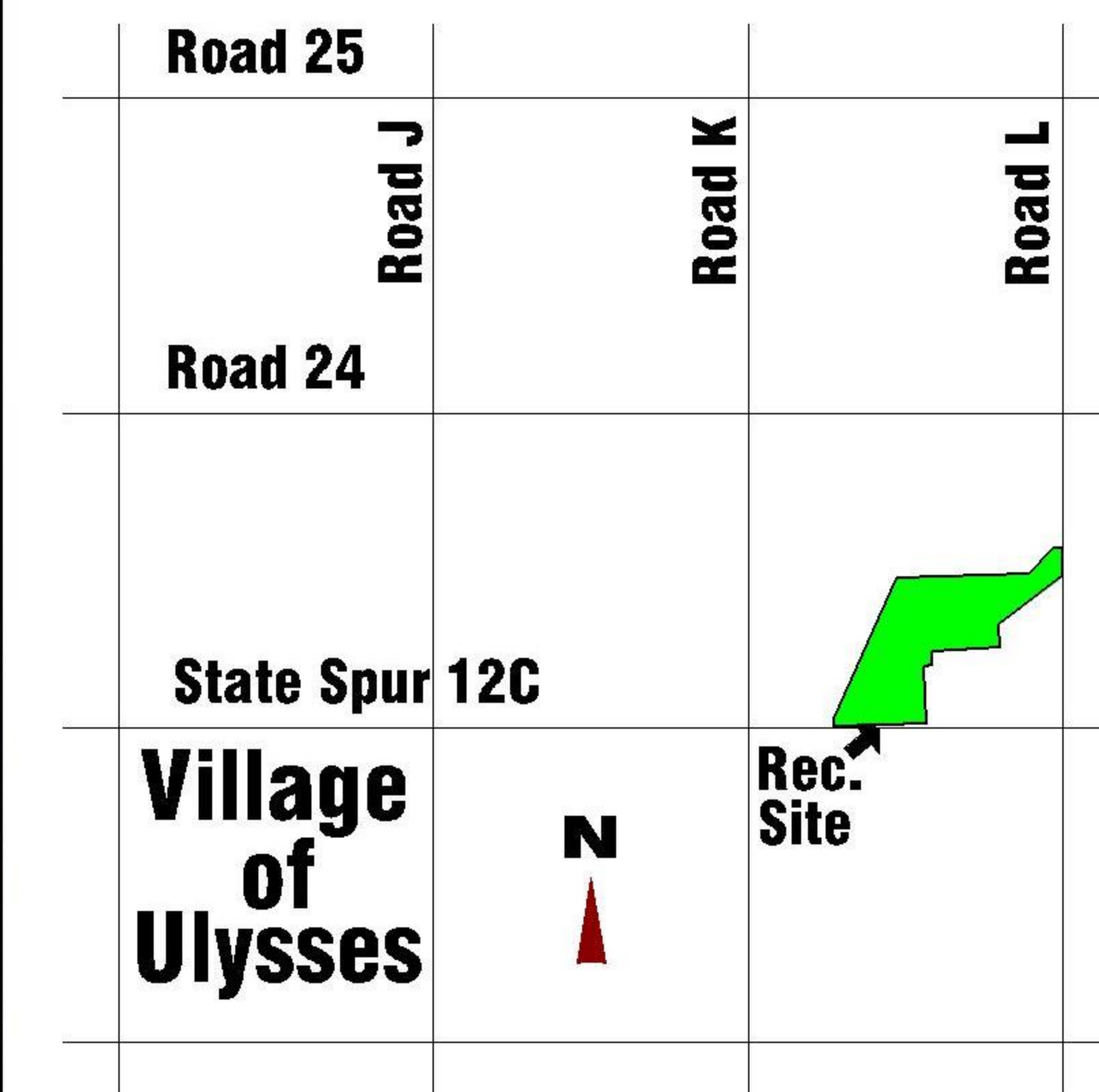
